

1. Pending approval, all changes will take effect and begin on August 1st 2016.
2. All funds contributed by players into pools shall be returned when won in accordance with the posted rules with no commission or administrative fee withheld.
3. Rules governing promotional pools shall be conspicuously posted in a location visible from each table, and shall designate the following:
 - a. The amount of funds contributed from each pot.
 - b. What type of hand it takes to win the pool (e.g. what constitutes a "bad beat").
 - c. How the promotional funds will be paid out.
 - d. How/when the contributed funds are added to the jackpots, secondary jackpots and promotional fund if applicable.
4. The amount of jackpots shall be conspicuously displayed in the poker room. At least once a day, the progressive sign or meter shall be updated to reflect the current pool amount.
 - a. The official jackpot amount to be paid will be based on the most recent Poker Bad Beat Spreadsheet accounting that has been made current to reflect any prior progressive sign or meter update.
 - b. The progressive sign or meter display is an unofficial posting of current jackpot amounts.
5. Promotion pool contributions will be collected and counted in a manner consistent with Golden Moon Hotel and Casino system of Internal Controls, page 8, Section XI-Card Game Procedures, Item F. (Promotional Progressive Pots and Pools).

Texas Hold'em Bad Beat Jackpots

1. The Main Jackpot will be 100% of the Official Texas Hold'em Jackpot posted on the updated Poker Bad Beat Jackpot Spreadsheet from Account 001 000 0000 26202.
2. Eligibility:
 - a. Game must be at full posted rake, have a minimum of 4 active players dealt into the qualifying hand, and the jackpot rake being collected.
 - b. There must be a minimum of \$20 in the pot. The amount of table rake and the jackpot rake are included when determining the size of the pot.
 - c. Time rake games will not be eligible for the bad beat jackpot.
3. Amount of funds to be contributed from each pot:
 - a. \$1.00 will be collected as the jackpot rake once the pot reaches \$20.
 - b. \$1.00 additional will be collected as the jackpot rake once the pot reaches \$40.
 - c. The maximum jackpot rake will be \$2.00.
4. What type of hand it takes to win the pool (e.g. what constitutes a "bad beat"):
 - a. Texas Hold'em Main Jackpot:
 - i. Aces full of jacks or higher ranking hand beaten by any four of a kind or better.
 - ii. In the event of three or more qualifying hands of Aces full of Jacks or better, the highest ranking hand will be considered to be the winner of the hand and the next highest ranking hand will be considered to be the loser of the hand for jackpot payout purposes.
 - b. The winning and losing hands must be the player's best combination of five cards and include both the player's hole cards.
 - i. When a player's hole card involves a "kicker", it must tie or beat the board.
 - ii. Aces full (full house) may not make use of three of a kind entirely on the board. Aces full must have at least one ace as a qualifying hole card.
5. How the promotional funds will be paid out:
 - a. The loser of the hand will win 40% of the current official jackpot. The winner of the hand will win 20% of the current official jackpot. All other players dealt into the qualifying hand at the table involved in the hand will win the remaining 40% split equality as a player's share.
 - b. In the event that a player is not eligible to participate in the bad beat jackpot (e.g. an associate of the resort) their share of the jackpot will be split as evenly as possible among the qualifying eligible players.
6. Amount/percentage of funds allocated to the primary and secondary jackpots and the promotional fund.
 - a. 30% of the Texas Hold'em Daily Jackpot drop will be allocated to the Hold'em Jackpot pool, Account number 001 000 0000 26202.
 - i. 50% will be allocated to the main jackpot total, until the main jackpot total reaches \$25,000. Once this cap is reached the 50% will be allocated to the promotional fund account number 001 000 0000 26201.
 - ii. 35% will be allocated to the Reset 1 total, until the Reset 1 total reaches \$25,000. Once this cap is reached the 35% will be allocated to the promotional fund account number 001 000 0000 26201.
 - iii. 15% will be allocated to the Reset 2 total, until the Reset 2 total reaches \$25,000. Once this cap is reached the 15% will be allocated to the promotional fund account number 001 000 0000 26201.
 - b. 70% of the Texas Hold'em Daily Jackpot drop will be allocated to the Poker Room Promotional Fund Account number 001 000 0000 26201.
7. Jackpot payouts and Reset:
 - a. When a Texas Hold'em main jackpot is paid:
 - i. 100% of Reset 1 will be allocated to the new main Texas Hold'em Jackpot total.
 - ii. 50% of Reset 2 will be allocated to the Reset 1 jackpot total.
8. The Texas Hold'em main jackpot will be a minimum of \$5,000.
 - a. In the event a Texas Hold'em main Jackpot occurs and the official jackpot is less than \$5,000, the difference will be allocated from the Poker Room Promotional Fund Account 001 000 00000 26201.

Omaha Bad Beat Jackpots

1. The Main Jackpot will be 100% of the official Omaha Jackpot posted on the updated Poker Bad Beat Jackpot spreadsheet for Account 001 000 0000 26204.
2. Eligibility:
 - a. Game must be at full posted rake, have a minimum of 4 active players dealt into the qualifying hand, and the jackpot rake being collected.
 - b. There must be a minimum of \$30 in the pot. The amount of table rake and the jackpot rake are included when determining the size of the pot.
 - c. Time Rake games will not be eligible for the bad beat jackpot.
3. Amount of funds to be contributed from each pot:
 - a. \$1.00 will be collected as the jackpot rake once the pot reaches \$20.
 - b. \$1.00 additional will be collected as the jackpot rake once the pot reaches \$40.
 - c. The maximum jackpot rake will be \$2.00.
4. What type of hand it takes to win the pool (e.g. what constitutes a "bad beat"):
 - a. Omaha Main Jackpot
 - i. Four sevens or higher ranking hand beaten.
 - ii. In the event of three or more qualifying hands of four sevens or better, the highest ranking hand will be considered to be the winner of the hand and the next highest ranking hand will be considered to be the loser of the hand for jackpot payout purposes.
 - b. The winning and losing hands must be the player's best combination of five cards and include both of the player's hold cards.
 - i. The winning and/or losing hand must use a pocket pair if qualifying with a four of a kind.
5. How the promotional funds will be paid out:
 - a. The loser of the hand will win 40% of the current official jackpot. The winner of the hand will win 20% of the current official jackpot. All other players dealt into the qualifying hand at the table involved in the hand will win the remaining 40% equally split as a player's share.
 - b. In the event that a player is not eligible to participate in the bad beat jackpot (e.g. an associate of the resort) their share of the jackpot will be split as evenly as possible among the qualifying eligible players.
6. Amount/percentage of funds allocated to the primary and secondary jackpots and the promotional fund:
 - a. 30% of the Omaha Daily Jackpot drop will be allocated to the Omaha Jackpot pool, Account number 001 000 0000 26204.
 - i. 50% will be allocated to the main jackpot total.
 - ii. 50% will be allocated to the Reset 1 total.
 - b. 70% of the Omaha Daily Jackpot drop will be allocated to the Poker Room Promotional Fund. Account Number 001 000 0000 26201.
7. Jackpot Payouts and Reset:
 - a. When an Omaha Main Jackpot is paid:
 - i. 50% of reset 1 will be allocated to the new main Omaha jackpot total.
8. The Omaha Main Jackpot will be a minimum of \$1,000.
 - a. In the event an Omaha Jackpot occurs and the official jackpot is less than \$1000, the difference will be allocated from the Poker Room Promotional Fund Account 001 000 0000 26201.

Rules that apply to all Jackpots

1. It is the Player's responsibility for calling attention to hands qualifying for any Bad Beat jackpot. The right to dispute a jackpot ends with the mucking or fouling of a qualifying hand.
2. It is the player's responsibility to protect their hands at all time. Unprotected hands will have no redress if fouled if the dealer or anyone else accidentally kills a hand before all verifications have been completed.
3. Tournament play and/or hands do not qualify for any Bad Beat Jackpots.
4. Any discussion or verbal attempt to construct a jackpot during the course of play may void payment and result in disqualification.
5. All hands are subject to video surveillance verifications. Play will be suspended until surveillance has verified they have collected all footage needed for the review and verification of the hand.
6. The playing cards involved in the hand will be inspected and verified in plain view on the table. Any deck involved in a bad beat jackpot that is defective, fouled, or does not contain the proper value and number of cards when verified will void payment and result in disqualification.
7. Payment of Jackpot funds will be authorized, upon satisfactory review of surveillance footage and playing cards verifications by authorized casino management or supervisory personnel.
8. Management reserves the right to consult with the Choctaw Gaming Commission regarding all jackpot verifications.
9. The Pearl River Poker Room has attempted to cover every rule, procedure and circumstance that may occur. In the event a decision is necessary that is not covered by the rules and regulations Pearl River Poker Room Supervisory Personnel decisions will be final.
10. Valid Pearl River Resort Rewards Club account and a valid Government I.D are required to participate.
11. Participants must be 21 years of age or older and in compliance with all Choctaw Gaming Commission rules and regulations.
12. All applicable federal and state taxes, fees, licenses, and prize claim arrangements are the responsibility of the winners.
13. Participation deems permission to use photograph or likeness and name in advertising and/or publicity without compensation, consideration, notice, review or consent, where permitted by law.
14. Pearl River Resort reserves the right to deny entry to any guest at its sole discretion.
15. All participants agree to abide by all related rules and regulations as published and amended and shall accept as final and binding the decision of Pearl River Resort. Violations of any rules may result in disqualifications.
16. After consulting with the Choctaw Gaming Commission, Pearl River Resort reserves the right to amend these rules and regulations at its sole discretion and to disqualify anyone due to violation of jackpot rules, to resolve any disputes, and/or modify at any time without prior notice.
